Renewing Our Partnerships in Justice and Security

The Launch of AIPJ3

Australia-Indonesia Partnership for Justice Phase 3 (AIPJ3) is a five-year program from May 2025 to May 2030. It aligns with Indonesia's National Development Plans (Long Term National Development Plan 2025-2045, Mid Term National Development Plan 2025-2029) and the Australia-Indonesia Development Partnership Plan 2024-2028.

AIPJ3 will focus on seven policy priorities that are important to both Indonesia and Australia: transparency and accountability, criminal justice reform, preventing violent extremism, addressing transnational crime, commercial law, access to justice, and women's leadership.

On 13 June 2025, Ministry of National Development Planning/Bappenas conducted a kickoff meeting with Government of Indonesia representatives to present an overview of the strategic priorities and outline the bridging grants for the AIPJ3 Inception Phase (June to December 2025).

The bridging grants fund the implementation of priority activities in 13 ministries/agencies.*

On 28 July 2025, Bappenas and DFAT launched AIPJ3 through the first Partnership Board Meeting, which approved AIPJ3 interim work plan. The launch was followed by a high-level lunch meeting with Government of Indonesia stakeholders' representatives.

Moving Forward Together

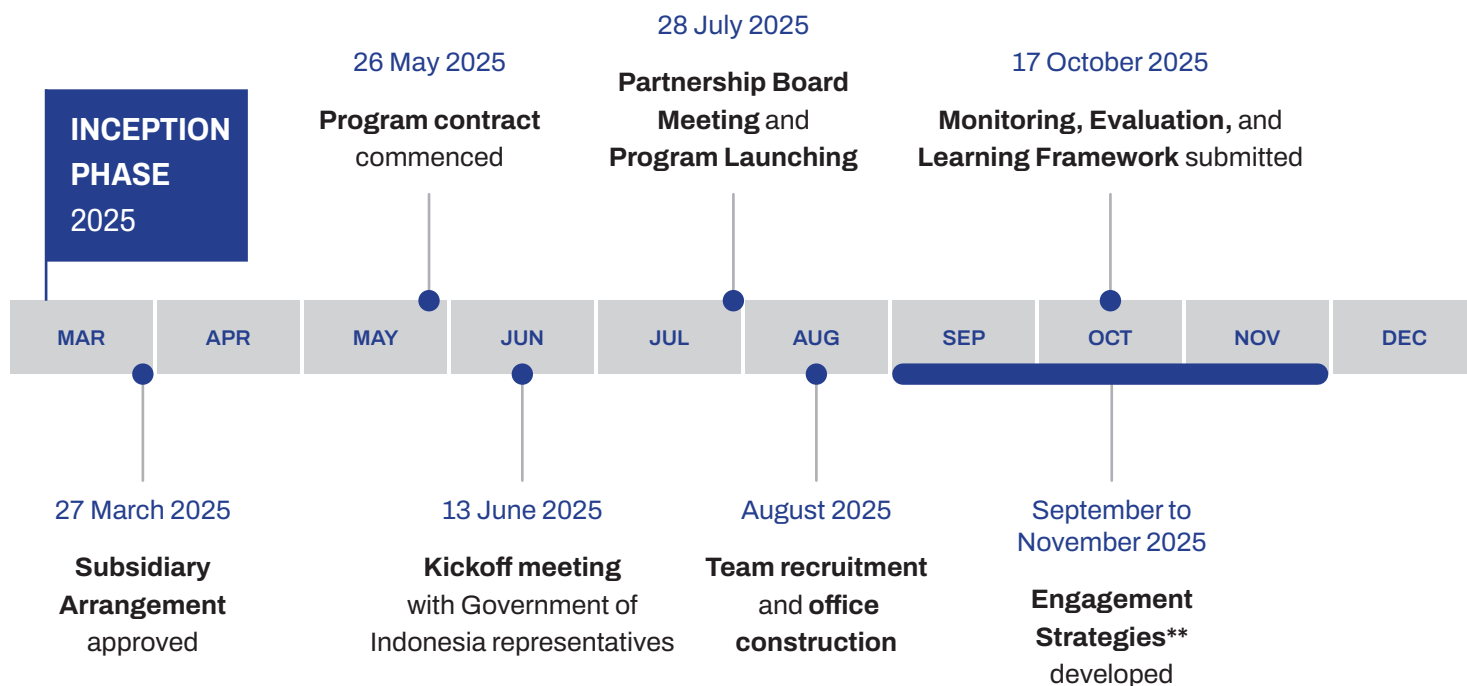

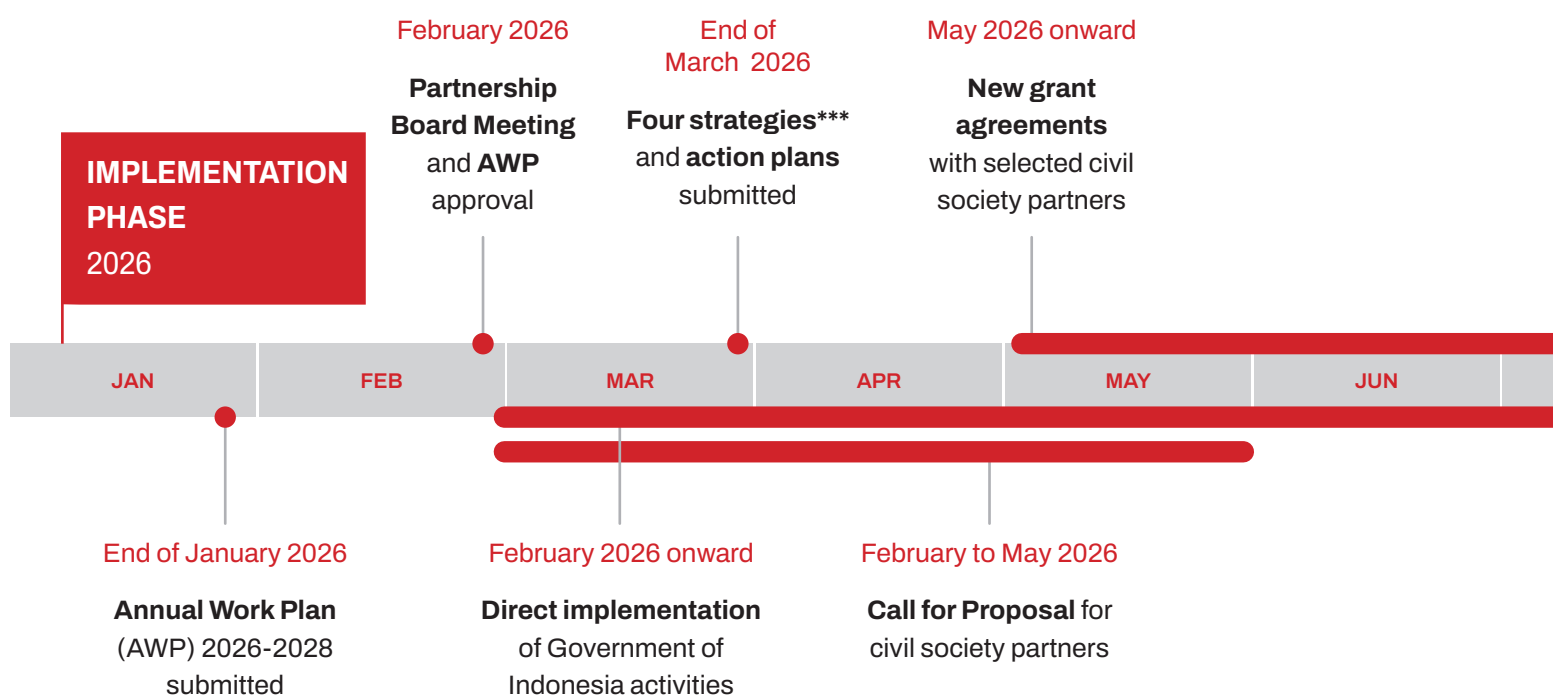
